


Training Provider Registrations

Training Provider registrations since 6/28/21 = 4,564





- Training Location Registrations
 Training Location registrations since 6/28/21 = 6,676 in US; 9 in PR
 - Vast majority approved same day
 - 826 traveling locations (across all 50 states, DC, and 11 US Territories)




Screenshots showing how to manually enter training certification records in the Registry

February 7, 2022: What to expect



Class A, B CDLs and P, S Endorsement Application Process On/After Feb. 7, 2022



- 1. Driver passes knowledge test at the SDLA
- 2. SDLA issues CLP
- 3. CLP holder completes ELDT courses, if needed
- Training provider submits the training certification record to the TPR
- 5. If driver is subject to ELDT, SDLA verifies completion of required training using State IT system or CSTIMS
- 6. CLP holder passes skills and road test
- 7. SDLA issues CDL or endorsement



H Endorsement Application Process On/After Feb 7, 2022



- 1. Driver TSA Security Threat Assessment is approved, background check completed
- 2. Driver completes the H endorsement training, if needed
- 3. Training provider submits training certification record in TPR.
- 4. If driver is subject to ELDT, SDLA verifies completion of required training using State IT system or CSTIMS.
- 5. Driver passes the H knowledge test.
- 6. SDLA issues H endorsement on CDL credential.

Responding to Stakeholder Questions

FROM TRAINING PROVIDERS

Do I need to register with FMCSA?

- Any entity that provides entry-level driver training must register in the Training Provider Registry. This may include individuals, public agencies, and municipalities.
- Entry level driver training includes training for individuals seeking to:
 - Obtain a Class A or Class B CDL for the first time
 - Upgrade an existing Class B to a Class A CDL; or
 - Obtain a passenger (P), school bus (S), or hazardous materials (H) endorsement for the first time

How can I submit training certification records?

- Provider and training locations must first be registered and approved
- Then, starting February 7, log in to the Training Provider Portal and click
 Manage Records to manually enter driver training information
- To log in, or start registration, visit https://tpr.fmcsa.dot.gov/provider



Responding to Stakeholder Questions

FROM CDL APPLICANTS

Do I need to complete entry-level driver training to take my skills or knowledge test?

 Consult the ELDT Applicability Flow Chart (coming soon) to determine if an individual is subject to the ELDT regulations.

My information is not in the Registry, but should be. What do I do?

- SDLAs must electronically verify training completion using data from the Training Provider Registry; SDLAs cannot accept any paper certificates, etc.
- Contact your training provider to ensure they have submitted certification correctly
- Provider is required to submit training certification by midnight of the second business day after the driver has completed training
